

2025 Sexual Misconduct Campus Climate Survey

Introduction and Background

The University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign is dedicated to fostering a caring community on our campus. Preventing and remedying sexual misconduct at Illinois is essential to a safe environment in which our students can learn and thrive. The university administered the *Sexual Misconduct Campus Climate Survey* in Spring 2025 to better understand students' experiences of sexual misconduct (which includes sexual or gender-based harassment, stalking, dating/domestic violence, and sexual violence), students' knowledge of the resources available to them, and perception of the response to incidents of sexual misconduct.

Survey Background

On August 6, 2021, a bill written by students and supported by survivor advocates in Illinois was signed into law by amending the Preventing Sexual Violence in Higher Education Act. This new law, Public Act 102-0325 (110 ILCS 155/35), mandated all institutions of higher education conduct an annual campus sexual misconduct climate survey to assess students' experiences, outcomes regarding their experiences, and perceptions of sexual violence and collegiate culture. The law called for the creation of a Task Force on Sexual Misconduct on Campus Climate Surveys to develop the base survey instrument and implementation guidance. The Task Force was charged with creating a "base survey," which focuses on 13 areas outlined in the statute:

- The number, type, and location of reported and unreported incidents of sexual misconduct.
- Student awareness of institutions' sexual misconduct policies and procedures.
- Whether the student was referred to victim support services and whether students were provided information on his/her/their rights.
- Student demographic information such as race/ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, disability status, and immigration status to help identify at-risk groups.
- The perceptions of campus safety and confidence in the higher education institution's ability to protect students against sexual misconduct.
- Contextual factors of a sexual misconduct incident and any student academic outcomes, such as withdrawing from classes or being placed on academic probation.

While the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign has conducted sexual misconduct surveys in the past, this is the first use of the new survey instrument created by the Task Force. As such, no direct year-over-year comparisons are available.

Administration

Dates and Population

The University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign administered the survey to students **February 18th – March 31st**. The survey was sent to all students enrolled in at least one credit hour in the following academic terms: Spring 2025, Fall 2024, Summer 2024. Participants were required to have been at least 18 years of age and physically located in the United States while completing the survey (as determined by legal counsel due to international privacy laws). A total of 66,270 students or former students were invited.

Advertisement and Incentives

Students were informed of the survey through campus emails from Chancellor Robert J. Jones. A campus [website](#) and [email address](#) were created to respond to questions. Posters were placed in campus cultural and resources centers, residence halls, and apartments. Presentations about the survey were given to various staff groups who work directly with students and student groups. Postcards with the survey information were distributed at various events (e.g. Panhellenic Council meeting, Black and Latinx Summit). Digital signage was distributed throughout campus units. Additional announcements were distributed via various campus newsletters, student organizations, and at events.

At the end of the survey, respondents had the option to register for an incentive drawing, including 50 Amazon electronic gift codes (\$50 each), 500 Amazon electronic gift codes (\$5 each), or Illinois promotional items. Contact information for incentives was completed on a form separate from the survey responses to maintain anonymity of responses.

Survey Administration

Student privacy and security were the primary concerns when administering the survey instrument. Respondents logged into feedback.illinois.edu via a single-sign-on process in order to verify they were eligible. Once in feedback.illinois.edu respondents could click on the survey link, and it would direct them to the Qualtrics survey instrument. No personally identifiable information was retained in the survey responses. Respondents were presented with the required informed consent that included notifying respondents the survey was voluntary, and they could skip any question.

The survey was offered in English only. We utilized a portion of the state's optional consent module that included Question 19a, c, d, f and Question 20 b, c, d, e. The base survey contained seven questions that were modifiable by the institutions.

- Question 4 – No modification made.
- Question 5 – Added 2024 and 2025 as an option.
- Question 7 - No modification made.
- Question 9 – We modified “on campus residence hall/dormitory” to “In University Housing (e.g., Townsend Hall (ISR), Sherman Hall, Ashton woods, etc.);” “Other on campus housing (apartment, house) to “In Private Certified Housing (e.g., Bromley Hall, Newman Hall, Stratford House, etc.);” “Fraternity or sorority house” to “In a Sorority/Fraternity House”, Off-campus institution -sponsored apartment/house” to “In an apartment or house in the Champaign, Urbana, or Savoy Community (e.g., The Dean, 309 E Green, etc.);” “Off-campus housing non-institution sponsored” to “In an apartment or house outside of the Champaign, Urbana, or Savoy community;” and “Other off-campus” to “Other.”
- Question 18 – We added examples to align with campus services. _1: (e.g. Counseling Center, McKinley Health Center). _2: (e.g. Rape Advocacy Counseling and Education Services (RACES), Courage Connection). _3: (e.g., Rosecrance, National Domestic Violence Hotline) _4: Illinois's Title IX Office.
- Question 87 – We modified _5 “attended a rally or other campus event about sexual misconduct or sexual assault” to “Attended an event, program, or rally about sexual misconduct or sexual assault;” _6 “Seen posters about sexual misconduct (e.g., raising awareness, preventing rape, defining sexual misconduct)” to “Seen posters or social media posts about sexual misconduct (e.g., raising awareness, preventing rape, defining sexual misconduct).” We added _16 “Completed annual online sexual assault prevention course, Voices for Change;” _17 “Participated in FYCARE: Consent and Relationship Education (for

first-year undergraduate students);” _18 “Participated in ICARE (the bystander intervention program);” _19 “Participated in I Heart Healthy Relationships (healthy dating program);” and _20 “Participated in GUARD (fraternity/sorority program).”

- Question 88 – We changed “Student code of conduct or honor code” to _7 “Student code of conduct” and added _8 “Information on the sexual misconduct policy.”

Report Overview

The report contains the total number of respondents to each base survey question and the number of respondents that chose each answer option. Per IBHE guidance, only students who complete at least through Question 33 of the base survey, are considered completed and can be used in the reporting and analysis. Additionally, if a survey base question or answer has fewer than 20 responses, “NR” is used for not reported in order to protect student privacy and anonymity. The acronym “PNTR” stands for Prefer Not to Respond.

Results include 2,031 total responses that answered a question at Q33 or later.
